


WHAT'S BREAST CANCER NOW'S SERVICE PLEDGE?

THE SERVICE PLEDGE AT BARNSLEY HOSPITAL NHS FOUNDATION TRUST

To find out what was important to patients at Barnsley Hospital NHS Foundation Trust, we carried out surveys and focus groups to hear what you had to say.

Then we worked together with patient representatives and members of the Barnsley Hospital NHS Foundation Trust breast cancer team to create goals based on this feedback.

Now, Barnsley Hospital NHS Foundation Trust is taking action.

Here's the feedback from patients and the changes that Barnsley NHS Foundation Trust is making:

Some patients didn't feel they were offered enough support during diagnosis and treatment.	Be clearer when offering patients a questionnaire about their concerns and support needs, known as a Holistic Needs Assessment (HNA).	Achieved
	Plan appointments with patients to focus on HNAs and planning their care.	Achieved
	Make sure patients and carers get access to support services.	April 2023
Some patients wanted more information about waiting times on the day of surgery and how to get support after surgery.	Tell patients the reason for waiting times on the day of surgery.	April 2023
	Make sure the pre-operative waiting area is patient-friendly.	Achieved
	Give patients information on who to contact out of hours with any concerns after surgery.	August 2023
	Create new photo resources for the different surgical options available so that patients can see how their body may look after their surgery.	Sept 2023
Some secondary breast cancer patients didn't feel they had access to a clinical nurse specialist. They felt their practical and emotional support needs weren't being met.	Explore the possibility of recruiting more staff resource to improve support and care for secondary breast cancer patients.	June 2023
	The breast team will join the Secondary Breast Cancer Nursing Group to talk about how best to support these patients.	April 2023
	Offer all secondary breast cancer patients an HNA.	April 2023
Some patients feel the co-ordination of their care could be	Make sure patients know who to contact as they move through their treatment.	April 2023

Offer an HNA to all primary breast cancer patients finishing treatment.

Refer patients to Moving Forward, Breast Cancer Now's course for people finishing primary breast cancer treatment.
