We wanted to find out what was important to patients at your NHS Foundation Trust. So, we carried out surveys and focus groups to hear what you had to say.

Then, working together with patient representatives and members of the trust's breast cancer team, we created goals based on this feedback.

Now, South Warwickshire University NHS Foundation Trust is taking action.

Here's the feedback and the changes that your trust is making:

Patients would like more private space in clinic areas, especially at diagnosis.	We'll explore potential opportunities to improve the clinic area and space available.	Ongoing
Patients could benefit from being signposted to support services while waiting for a diagnosis.	We'll give patients information about Breast Cancer Now's helpline at the point of investigation, so they can access further information and support at this time.	Ongoing
	We'll display information about Breast Cancer Now's helpline on screens within waiting areas.	Ongoing
Patients were sometimes unaware of the waiting time for results.	We'll make sure we communicate an accurate waiting time verbally to patients at all stages.	Completed
Patients would have liked support to be more tailored at diagnosis and throughout.	We'll offer patients a follow up call with a cancer navigator where a Holistic Needs Assessment (HNA) will be discussed.	Ongoing
	We'll produce a digital version of our patient diary so that patients can choose which version they'd prefer to have.	Completed
Patients didn't always feel they had enough information on how they might look after surgery.	We'll give patients information on services such as Keeping Abreast, Flat Friends and Breast Cancer Now's Someone Like Me service to support them around surgery.	Completed
Patients would have liked more information about bra and prosthesis fitting.	We'll give patients having surgery a leaflet about prosthesis and bra fitting. We'll also offer patients a free bra after their surgery.	Completed
Patients would have liked more information on support available for men and younger women.	We'll signpost patients to information on support services for men or younger women.	Ongoing
	We'll look into producing some in-house resources specific to patients being treated at South Warwickshire University NHS Foundation Trust.	Completed

Some patients didn't feel their care was as joined up as it could have been.	Patients receiving CDK4/6 drug treatments will be supported within a nurse led clinic by the same clinical nurse specialist.	Completed
	Patients on extended adjuvant treatments will be supported by the new oncology clinical nurse specialist in a nurse led clinic.	Completed
	We've developed a better way of working with the multidisciplinary team for secondary breast cancer patients which will improve their coordination of care.	Completed
Some primary breast cancer patients would have liked more information and support around the end of treatment.	Patients who are having chemotherapy will have access to the oncology team for 6 weeks after their treatment. They'll also be able to access the oncology nurse for support at any time.	Completed
	We'll offer patients a Holistic Need Assessment (HNA) during their nurse led end of treatment discussion, so that we can offer the individualised, practical and emotional support they need and signpost to community resources.	Completed
Secondary breast cancer patients would like tailored support and information on planning for the future.	We'll introduce patients to Respect forms when they meet their key contact. This will open up the opportunity to discuss planning for the future.	Completed
Secondary breast cancer patients would like the opportunity to meet others in a similar situation.	We'll invite patients with secondary breast cancer to join our bi-monthly support group, where they can meet other patients in an informal setting.	Completed
